I'm from Ballina in Co. Mayo. I come from a suckler farming background. I completed third-level education in May 2017 with a honours bachelors degree in Agriculture and Environmental management.

What attracted you to apply to the position? I was attracted to apply for the position because it wasn't only a career, but a learning curve also. Learn while you work, make experience a lesson. I was ambitious to work for such a large company in the West of Ireland as I grew up close to our local co-op store, so it was obvious to me when I heard about the programme to apply.
